Osage County Proves Hand Counting Success

The Myth: Osage County's Hand Count Failed

A May 2023 opinion piece by Osage County's former Clerk claims the April 2023 hand-counted election was inefficient and costly, alleging it didn't go well. Published in the "Mailbag" section of the <u>Unterrified Democrat</u>, this unverified piece — lacking fact-checking or opposing views — was emailed to clerks and Secretaries of State nationwide, amplifying its reach. It is the <u>sole</u> critique, unsupported by evidence, suggesting an agenda to discredit hand counting.

Finding: Osage County Election Was a Success

The hand count saved \$16,000, as confirmed by a county commissioner, despite the clerk's unverified cost claims (no financial reports provided). Westphalia's team counted 481 ballots in 5 hours, delivering same-day results. Judges called it "fun" and efficient, with built-in checks ensuring accuracy.

Post-election, the clerk and staff of the former SOS unsealed ballots, ran them through tabulators, and re-hand-counted them, trying to prove inaccuracies — they found none. A sheriff's investigation later identified administrative violations in these post-election actions, not the hand count, yet the former SOS took no action, raising questions about the opinion piece's motive.

Demand Transparency in Election Claims

Challenge objections: ask if the clerk's assertions were fact-checked. My rebuttal at ReturntoHandCounting.com/ShowMeMore provides evidence of Osage's success, countering the apparent efforts to protect machine-based systems.
