SUBJECT: Criminal Complaint Against John Poulos, CEO of Dominion Voting Systems

Dear Ms. Nessel,

During his testimony under oath on December 15, 2020 before the Michigan Senate Oversight Committee, Dominion Voting Systems CEO John Poulos is alleged to have committed 15 counts of perjury. Under MCL 750.423, such conduct is a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 15 years. Under Chapter 14 of Michigan Compiled Law, the Michigan Attorney General has broad authority to prosecute violations of the law on behalf of the people of the State of Michigan.

On behalf of the Michigan Grassroots Alliance, I am thereby formally requesting that the Michigan Attorney General's Office open an investigation into the veracity of the statements made by Mr. Poulos during his Senate testimony. Should the results of the investigation merit such actions, I request that the Attorney General issue formal indictments against Mr. Poulos for his attempts to deceive the citizens of Michigan.

In support of this request, I have enclosed a 51-page report that cites the alleged false statement made by Mr. Poulos, an explanation of the truth regarding his statement, an explanation of why his false statement was materially false and the evidence that supports these assertions.
